Membership Details and Dues Info

- Any student in FRMS can join SOS at any time during the school year.
- SOS is a servant-leadership group that trains our members to attain empathy, organization, and leadership skills while they volunteer to serve the needy.
- Membership in SOS allows students to participate in SOS throughout school year. Dues are the life-blood of what pays for our ability to conduct events that help the needy and build empathy in our members.
- All new & members from previous year(s) are required to pay annual dues. **(part 1 of registration for SOS)**
- *One member dues = \$40 annually*
- *Two members in same family dues = \$80 annually*
- *Three + members from family dues = \$100 annually*
- Select “**financial hardship**” when asked during online registration to reduce required dues

- Visit SOS site to sign up for Re-mind.com text blasts to stay up to date with details of SOS events and needs of souls in crisis in the community. **(part 3)**

- ◆ \$10,000 grant from Spitzer Toyota to aid our mission to serve the needy

The History of Serving Other Souls

The founding opportunity for SOS came in the wake of the tornadoes that struck many homes and schools in Hempfield & the Japanese tsunami in the Spring of 2011. FRMS students collaborated together to create an in

to organize donations to be given to those affected by the tornado. 49 of the 50 stated they had never volunteered before, and all 50 stated they would love to do again. These responses became the genesis of SOS.

The Financial Impact Of SOS

Since the inception of SOS in 2011, we have handed out over \$237,000 in monies, clothing, food, and gift cards that have benefited the needy of our community.



SOS members and their family members or friends set up a mobile store front with donations of coats, boots, gloves, hats, sweatshirts, and other cold weather gear. The homeless of Pittsburgh visit these store fronts set up at Shepherd's Heart Mission and Light of Life Mission annually on Christmas Eve morning.

For every \$1 donated to SOS, we are able to convert that into \$1.11 donated to the needy in the form of money, clothing, food, or gift cards.
